# Dear Friends and Partners, shalom!

The war with Iran is over - at least for now - and we are so thankful to **reopen Aviv Center** in Tel Aviv! With everything that happened last month, we did not get a chance to share a special moment that took place just before the war began: **an unexpected encounter on the streets** 

near Aviv Center.

As usual, on that day, a part of our volunteer group left the Center and headed out into the nearby streets to hand out food and bandage wounds. Suddenly, in the middle of our outreach, two young Israeli men approached us. They looked to be around 25 years old, dressed in army shirts marked with unit insignias – likely reservists called up for extended duty. Their posture, their gaze – everything about them showed seriousness and strength. These were the kind of young men often seen as part of Israel's elite.

They stopped in front of our team.

"Can we speak with you?" one asked.

"Of course. How can we help?"

Then they said something that moved us deeply:

"We live nearby. We see you out here almost every day. We see what you do for the people on the street. And... we just wanted to thank you."

"We're Christians," someone from our team replied. "This is our ministry to God."

They nodded. "We know. We've seen you pray, talk with people, clean their wounds. Sometimes we watch from our windows. And we want you to know – we really appreciate it."

It was a quiet, unexpected testimony. We weren't helping *them*. We didn't even know they were watching. But they saw. And what they saw touched their hearts – a glimpse of the love of Christ in action.

In Israeli society, believers like us often face rejection, suspicion, even mockery. And yet these strong, confident young men came with words of kindness and gratitude. It felt like a glass of cold water in a dry and weary land.

Please pray for these men, and for all the Israelis who see our outreach – that they would seek and find the One their hearts are longing for: the Messiah of Israel.

One doctor bluntly told her: "Even prayer won't help – only surgery." But another, more compassionate physician in Soroka hospital offered to try a spinal injection - "Maybe it will help for a month, maybe more," she said.

That was **four months ago**. Since then, Tatiana has lived completely pain-free. She's back on her feet - working, supporting her disabled mother, and serving the women at the Shelter with renewed strength and joy. Praise the Lord!
