It was a very hot day, and many young men and women came into Aviv Center. Right away they asked for food – some wanted soup, others preferred sandwiches or pasta. And then, suddenly, I noticed a woman walking into the center.

She was older, dressed neatly and beautifully, with her hair carefully styled. There was calmness in her eyes, smile on her face, and her movements were graceful and composed. It was clear she didn't belong to this place or to the streets.

As she came closer, still smiling, I thought to myself, "Thank God! Maybe another volunteer has come to help us today."

But as she approached, I looked more carefully at her face – and suddenly realized I knew her!

About a year ago, she left her old life on the streets and everything that came with it. Now, she attends one of the churches in Tel Aviv and also comes to Aviv center on Sundays: to join a weekly Bible study that one of our lady volunteers started several months ago on the second floor of Aviv Center –



meetings specifically for women who were once involved in prostitution.

I thought to myself, "How incredible is the mercy and power of the Lord – how He can transform people both on the inside and outwardly!"

She was simply unrecognizable.

She came up to me, smiled, and said:

"Hi. I'm going upstairs to the class now. I really love your pasta with meat. If there's any left later, would you mind saving me a small portion? I'd love to have some after the lesson."

Then she added, "But if there's none left, that's okay. Just give it to someone who needs it more."

And I stood there for a moment, deeply moved. A year ago, she had come in for food and nothing more – broken, tired, and trapped. And now, she walks in with dignity, peace, and purpose.

The same person, yet completely renewed.

God doesn't just rescue people – He restores them. He gives them a new identity, a new heart, and even a new face to the world.

Praise the Lord for His precious and amazing miracles!

One day, our men's rehab center received an unexpected call from a group of social workers.

"Can you help us just for one night?" they asked.

A man battling alcoholism had to be urgently transferred from a state-run shelter after a conflict, but the new shelter in Beersheva could only receive him the next day. Of course, we agreed, and that's how Dan* arrived at our door. We welcomed him with a meal, a bed, and a quiet night of peace.

The next morning, he came to me with an

unexpected request.

"Can I stay? Not just another night – I want to live here. This place is different. The way the men treat each other, the atmosphere – it makes me feel like a different person."

I was deeply moved. "We'd love to have you," I said, "but we made an agreement with the social workers, and I can't break it." I gave him my number and invited him to visit our Bible lessons and church services.

We said goodbye as friends. But I keep thinking of his words: "It's different here."

Please pray for Dan* – that he continues to seek that "something different" we know is truly Someone!
